Position Overview:

The Center for Wooden Boats (CWB) offers Pond Boat Sailing on Saturdays and Sundays from May-October at the Lake Union Park Model Boat Pond. This program brings people of all ages and skill-levels in contact with our historic collection of wooden pond boats. The Pond Boat Attendant is responsible for engaging the public in fun and safe use of the fleet, instructing visitors on the physics of sailing and educating the public about CWB and maritime heritage.

Responsibilities:

- Open and close pond boat operations
- Engage public and give sailing instruction for fun and safe use of boats
- Supervise use of boats on the pond during special events
- Collect donations for the program
- Assist in repairing and maintaining the fleet
- Follow safety and emergency procedures
- Work independently and with volunteers
- Work with Youth Sailing & R-Boat Program Manager to evaluate and improve program
