As Student Docents accepted applicants will gain valuable experience including public speaking, leadership, and customer service skills while volunteering

at our beautiful South Lake Union location! No docent or nautical experience is required, just enthusiasm and dedication! The program is 12 weeks and runs in the months of June - September. Although there are various shifts available to accommodate flexible schedules, Student Docents should expect to volunteer at least 30 hours over the entire summer.
