

## A message from the Executive Director

2020 was a year like no other for both The Center for Wooden Boats (CWB) and myself. I never imagined I would be taking over the helm of this organization right when a global pandemic was taking hold. Shutting down programs and locking your doors to the public is not an ideal way to start in a new position. My angst was quickly buoyed though, as the CWB community coalesced around the challenge. Staff, volunteers, members, trustees, and longtime supporters all came together to help provide the organization with the support it needed. We made a conscious decision to deliver on our mission as best we could in any way possible. We held our first ever virtual fundraiser which was a huge success. That event taught us that we could still connect with our community in the digital world. We went on to increase our social media presence, moved meetings onto Zoom, held virtual volunteer orientations and Third Friday Speaker talks, and began utilizing virtual-only volunteers to tackle new endeavors such as podcasts and exhibit creation. The move to digital for CWB was long needed and is an area we will continue to focus on in the future.

Not all CWB's innovations were in the virtual sphere, though. CWB navigated an ever changing sea of Covid rules and regulations for reopening. We adapted our operational processes so people could enjoy the water feeling safe and socially distanced. We instituted online registrations for livery rentals, cleaning procedures for individual sailing lessons, new protocols for youth summer camps, and even brought volunteers back to the docks outdoors. We formed new partnerships with other organizations to provide sailing and boat building experiences for under served youth and created the Public Peapod Program to provide free access to the water. The positive response to our efforts was overwhelming, and the smile on people's faces told us we were on the right track.

By the end of the year, we were all exhausted, but could look back with pride on all that was accomplished. Looking forward, 2021 is CWB's 45th Anniversary and we'll be sharing stories from our past while celebrating all that the organization has accomplished. Given the resolve this organization has shown over the last year, I couldn't be more excited and hopeful for what the future will hold.




