ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The Center for Wooden Boats

The undersigned, Dick Wagner, Pat Ford, Marty Loken, Robert Chapel, Land Washburn and Colleen Wagner, for the purposes of forming a corporation under the non-profit laws, RCW 24.03, of the State of Washington, state:

I

The name of the corporation shall be The Center for Wooden Boats

ΙΙ

The term of existence shall be in perpetuity and until dissolution by the incorporators.

III

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

To obtain, preserve and disseminate knowledge of traditional small
watercraft; to offer educational displays and services related to
traditional wooden boats; to build, restore and preserve traditional
small craft, particularly wooden boats unique to the Northwest region
of the United States; to share information, traditional small-boat
plans, small-craft history and woodcraft skills with others. The
Center for Wooden Boats will operate for charitable, educational
and scientific purposes, and may, for such purposes, make distributions

to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

VI

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized

and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Not withstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

VII

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
